Meeting at the Wyndham Riverfront Hotel

Located on the bank of the Arkansas River, just blocks from Verizon Arena and Downtown Little Rock, the Wyndham is next door to Dickey Stephens Ballpark, and within walking distance to both Historic Argenta and the Rivermarket Entertainment Districts.

The meeting will include all of the usual fun—we'll open with our traditional Friday evening reception, followed by interesting papers on Saturday, the ARF silent auction, awards, a delicious banquet and keynote presentation.

Accommodations

The Wyndham is located at 2 Riverfront Place, North Little Rock, just a few miles south of I-40. The room rate for Annual Meeting attendees is \$89.00 for single or double occupancy and \$10.00 for each additional person, plus tax. Breakfast is included. The maximum number of people per room is 4. Be sure to mention that you are with the Arkansas Archeological Society. Saturday Keynote Speaker

Dr. Jan F. Simek is the Interim Head; Professor and Distinguished Professor of Science at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. He has a M.A. and Ph.D. in Anthropology from the State University of New York at Binghamton. Simek generally publishes and presents about rock art in the Southeast, discussing iconography and associated meanings, with additional emphasis on the Paleolithic and cave archeology.

Dr. Simek's presentation will immediately follow the banquet. Conference attendees who choose to dine elsewhere are welcome to rejoin the group for the presentation. Please mark your registration form accordingly.

Sunday Tours

Plum Bayou Garden – Toltec Mounds

Archeological State Park, Scott, AR, 9:30 am.

A permanent new interpretive landscape, the Plum Bayou Garden highlights the several thousand-year history of plant domestication and gardening and farming among the Indians of Arkansas. It features wild progenitors of ancient Eastern North American crops, modern varieties of crop plants that are similar to ancient ones, as well as a smaller selection of key wild plant resources used intensively for both food and technological purposes. Dr. Elizabeth Horton will conduct the tour. Preregistration is required on the registration form.

Old State House Museum – 300 West Markham, Little Rock. Hours: 1:00 – 5:00 pm. On own.

Exhibit: "Cabinet of Curiosities: Treasures from the University of Arkansas Museum Collections" shows diverse collections that range from dinosaur toes to Ming Dynasty pottery to a machine gun allegedly taken from Bonnie and Clyde's car. Other exhibits include "The Legacy of Arkansas Women: As Long as Life Shall Last," "Pillar of Power," "On the Stump: Arkansas Political History," the 1836 House of Representatives Chamber, and "First Families: Mingling of Politics and Culture." Admission is free.

Historic Arkansas Museum – 200 E. 3rd, Little Rock. Museum Center Hours: 1:00 – 5:00 pm. Free admission. Historic Grounds Hours: 1:00 -5:00 pm. \$2.50 for adults, \$1 for children under 18. On own.

Historic Arkansas Museum is a historic site museum of Arkansas's frontier days. Five pre-Civil War houses, on their original block, are restored to antebellum appearances, so you can learn about pre-Civil War life in Arkansas. Exhibits include "We Walk in Two Worlds," the Knife Gallery, "The Great War: Arkansas in World War I," and "A Diamond in the Rough: 75 Years of Historic Arkansas Museum," to name a few.
