This year the field excavation will be under the direction of Dr. Carl Drexler, Station Archeologist, Arkansas Archeological Survey – SAU. Our Headquarters will be at the University of Arkansas-Cossatot in the Adams Agricultural Building and Society camping area will be at the Army Corps of Engineers' Pine Ridge campground. PLEASE READ THE INFORMATION ABOUT CAMPING ARRANGEMENTS IN THE WHITE PAGES OF THIS *FIELD NOTES!* Specific details about research plans, excavation techniques, and daily schedules will be sent in a packet to those who register.

Plan to arrive for check-in at Headquarters the day before your first working day,
which begins at 6:30 am (when vans leave the camp)!
Headquarters Office Hours are from 6:00 am to 5:00 pm!

Membership

You must be a member of the Arkansas Archeological Society for 2019 to attend the Training Program. If you are not already a 2019 member, please send membership dues and include a membership form (located on the back page of this *Field Notes* or online at www.arkarch.org) with your Training Program Registration Form. You can also become a member online at the Society's website.

Under Age 18 and Minimum Age

All participants under age 18 must have a parent, guardian or adult sponsor with them. **The adult must also register and be with the child at all times.** Please give the age of each child under 18 on the Registration Form. Minimum age is 8 years old.

No children younger than 8 years old may participate in the Training Program and
no unregistered children are permitted on site or in the seminars.

Housing

Anyone wishing to camp at the Society's campground must indicate this on the Registration Form. Several RV camping spots have been secured at the Pine Ridge campground in order to keep as many Society participants together as possible. See details in the white pages of this *Field Notes*. Camping charges will be tents – \$9, pop-up campers – \$12, and \$15 for RVs per day. Generators are not allowed.

Meals

Each person is responsible for his/her own meals. Information about grocery stores, restaurants, etc. will be included in the packet to be picked up at Headquarters when you arrive. For campers, ice can be purchased at stores in De Queen. Because the lunch break is brief, everyone should bring lunch with them each day.

Transportation

Transportation to and from the sites will be by vans. All participants who are camping will need to meet at the designated spot at camp to ride in the vans going to Headquarters, lab and seminars, and from there, to the sites. There is limited parking available at camp. Those participants not staying in the camp (staying in hotels or commuting from home), can park at the UA-Cossatot, Adams Agricultural Building parking area. The vans will stop there to pick up anyone needing to go to the field.

ORIENTATIONS ARE REQUIRED BEFORE ANYONE BEGINS ANY ACTIVITIES!

Beginners' Orientations start in the MORNING at 7:00 am in the designated room at the UA-Cossatot campus. **If this is your first year in our Training Program, you must attend a Beginners' Orientation before you can participate in any activities.** Please indicate you will attend Beginners' Orientation on the Registration Form. If you have not been to our Training Program in several years you may re-take Beginners' Orientation, if you wish, but it is not required. **The last Beginners' Orientation will be given at 5:30 pm on Monday, June 17th.** Beginners' Orientation will be taught by Ann Early. Short orientation for returnees will be given at the site.

Seminars Offered

Participants may take one seminar each weekly session of the Training Program. Some seminars require completion of prerequisites, unless special permission is granted, as noted below. Most seminars are held for 4 hours each day and last for 5 days. Participants must attend all days of a seminar to complete it. Since most seminars take half of each day, participants are able to do fieldwork or work in the lab the other half of the day. The Basic Excavation Seminar lasts the entire day for 5 days: it consists of ½ day in class and ½ day doing fieldwork under the instructor's supervision. Paleoethnobotany is an all-day class with flotation training and experience. Caddo Ceramics is a ½ day class with participants continuing in the lab for the afternoon. Some seminars have a limit on the number of participants. Early registration is highly recommended. Seminars may be subject to cancellation if fewer than 3 people register.
